


About your Ports

- Enterprise Agency of the State (NCGS §136-260)
- Employs approx. 240; Handles 3M tons and 150,000 containers annually; generates revenue between \$35M and \$45M
- Generates earnings that more than cover day-to-day operating expenses
- Movement of cargo, berthing of vessels and port services provides port revenue and supports capital maintenance and port development
- Eligible to compete with Universities and other State Agencies for R&R and Capital Appropriations
- May 2014, NCDOT approved \$833,000 funds for rail improvements (50% match for rail projects)
- Moving towards more public/private partnerships

- 500,000 TEU Annual Thruput Capacity
- 3 Berths for Panamax and Post-Panamax Vessels
- 7 Cranes including 4 new Post-Panamax Cranes
- NC Ports employees perform terminal operations
- On dock Rail

- New woodchip export terminal


- Support more than 65,000 statewide jobs*

- \$4.4 billion remained/manufactured in NC*




NCSU-ITRE Economic Contribution Study-2011


- Long term lease on port property

- Design, finance, build facilities, \$35M
- Commence exports in 2015





Port of Wilmington Cold Storage



- Three-phase construction 300,000 sq. ft. total
- 100,000 sq. ft. initial construction; Phases 2-3 will each include 100,000 sq. ft. expansions
- Four bays, full capacity at 12,500 pallet positions

 Pork & Poultry; Seafood; Sweet Potatoes Fruits & Vegetables; Bananas




